Rick started his Municipal Administration career in 1978 as the assistant Administrator of the Rural Municipality of Hoodoo #401 in Cudworth, later that year he accepted the position of Administrator with the Rural Municipality of Hudson Bay #394. In 1983, he became the Administrator of the town of Hudson Bay, a position he holds to this day. He graduated from the University of Regina's Senior Local Government Administration Program and holds a Urban Superior " A " and Rural " A " Certificates in Local Government Administration.

With respect to his involvement in Snowmobiling Rick was a founding member of the Hudson Bay Trail Riders in 1988 and has served in all Executive positions included President for several years. The club operates in excess of 500km of groomed trails and currently Rick is the Club's Trail Committee Chair. He was also a founding member of the Porcupine Forest Snowmobile Association; a regional group who initiated Saskatchewan's original Route 66 and proposed the first Trail Pass system prior to its adoption on a Provincial level. He has served as an SSA Director for several years in the 1990's and is currently the Zone 2 Trail Fund Rep. Rick was chosen as Saskatchewan Snowmobiler of the Year in 1990.

Ricks current community involvements include: Economic Development and Tourism Committee member, Chairman of The Etomami Valley REDA and Regional Park Secretary Treasurer
